Thirtieth Bill Turner Trophy champion to be decided

Bass High School were crowned NSW State Champions, in 1991, in what was the first under-15 girls NSW Combined High Schools statewide knock-out competition.

Today and tomorrow Bill Turner School Football will stage the 30th Finals Series in what is now known as the Bill Turner Trophy for Girls.

Unfortunately COVID thwarted the 2020 and 2021 series but we are back with four exciting teams ready to take the field, only one can win the coveted trophy.

Bass High girls defeated Colo High School 4-1 in the inaugural final where Michelle Watson (pictured below receiving her award) was named the "best and fairest" with a stunning hat trick of goals.



Coach Peter de Jong described Michelle's third "a beautiful curling shot from 25 metres out".

Michelle Watson was the first, of many to follow, who have represented their country with the Matildas having played in what is now the Bill Turner Trophy.

"The spectators were treated to some tremendous saves by the goalkeeper Natalie Harrison. One in particular, a great reflex action which pushed the ball onto the crossbar and out of harm's way, frustrating the Colo attackers," De Jong wrote in his match report.

"This final was won, not just in one night, but as a result of hard work in our wins to reach the final ... by the efforts and hard work of all the girls."

Bill Turner School Football took the Girls competition under their wing in 2000 when NSW CHS was struggling to resource the competition and it has grown substantially to the point where schools from Cairns to Melbourne feature.

Bill Turner – 2013 Medal of the Order of Australia

Bill Turner was posthumously awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia by the NSW Governor on September 13 at Government House, Sydney. The award is for “service to football, and to the community, particularly youth.” Bill Turner worked tirelessly with young people and school soccer while he was a music teacher at Lake Macquarie High (1961-1989). Through the 1960’s and 1970’s he helped form an Australian Schools Soccer programme, which included taking talented youngsters to play overseas. He was extensively involved with NSW Combined High Schools Soccer, which convened school competitions particularly for older youth. Bill and his committee established a knockout competition for 15 year olds, and the committee voted in Bill’s absence to name the competition after him, as a tribute to his two decades of dedication to youth football. Bill’s vision and leadership then helped the team take the competition from 34 teams in 1979, to over 800 teams presently.

Bill was also involved in school music, and he was instrumental in regional events featuring the best local musicians. These concerts were the forerunners of the current spectaculars.

With both music and football, Bill had a strong desire to provide opportunity for fun and involvement for high school students. He also wanted to ensure that the most talented youth would have a chance to shine, and be noticed, especially those young people not from the capital cities.



HISTORY OF THE BILL TURNER TROPHY

In 1990 Ron Pratt and Sue Andrews of Combined High Schools were approached to introduce a knockout competition for Junior Girls. With the cooperation of the NSW Soccer Federation such a competition began in 1991 with Bass High the first winners. In 1994 and 1995 Lindsay Hewison and Warren Sheelah organised the competition, with Louise Yates taking over in 1996-1999. With the demise of the NSW Soccer Federation competition, the year 2000 saw the Northern NSW Schools Soccer Association Inc. introduce the Bill Turner Trophy and Lindsay Hewison Shield. Entries came from Northern NSW, NSW, ACT, QLD, Victoria. Brisbane's Cavendish Road were worthy winners of the expanded competition, in 2003-2004 following on from Canberra High's 3rd place of eleven years ago. 2004 also saw a development competition commence in Western Australia which has been put on hold owing to not having a major sponsor.



The Bill Turner Cup & Trophy

In 1979 a number of dedicated secondary school teachers met together and formed Northern NSW Schools Soccer. It was chaired by well known football identity and long serving Booragul High School (now Lake Macquarie High) teacher, Bill Turner.

During his absence from an executive meeting, they chose to name the competition the “Bill Turner Cup” and have it open to all State and Private Secondary Schools. In that year 34 such schools entered from around the Hunter Region.

Before a ball had been kicked, it had been brought to the attention of the leaders of the Northern NSW Soccer Federation. High profile, forward thinking and hard working president Stefan Kamasz plus his enthusiastic executive, studied, then embraced its whole FIFA Junior Rules concept . . . with endorsement, financial assistance and totally understood, affiliation.

The first ever final featured Belmont High and Whitebridge High at the famous Crystal Palace ground Wallsend.

Between 1997 and 2013 all series finals were conducted at the Jack McLaughlan Ground, home of the Edgeworth Eagles State League Soccer Club from the City of Lake Macquarie. Since 2015 finals have been conducted at the Lake Macquarie Regional Football Facility, home of Northern NSW Football.

In the year 2000 a request to take over an established, same age, girls competition was accepted, and the executive named it the Bill Turner Trophy. Its growth has been outstanding and now in entries, matches the cup.

For many years now, the Mayor and Councillors for the City of Lake Macquarie have welcomed all eight cup and trophy semifinalists, team officials, school supporters, special guests and chosen speakers to a Civic Reception, held at their Speers Point Auditorium. Sincere thanks is ever expressed, and all eight semifinalists are required to attend.

Efforts to obtain sponsorship for the competitions and / or finals series have had no success. Consequently, the executive has been compelled to charge each school entering a moderate entry fee. Apart from the two football state financial sponsors Northern NSW and NSW, the executive, is very grateful to receive from a number of industries, gifts, to be presented to players for special achievements.

The Noel Cocking Shield

Bill Turner School Football has commissioned a shield in honour of Noel Cocking an inaugural executive member of the Bill Turner Cup committee.

Noel is still active within the executive currently holding the position of Northern NSW State Manager.

The Noel Cocking Shield is presented, annually, to the winner of the Newcastle Area Final in the Bill Turner Cup recognising Noel's longtime involvement with the competition.

The Bill Turner Cup was first contested in 1979, with Noel, a former Kotara High School teacher, an integral member of the organising committee.

"Noel's involvement with school football started in 1969," explained Executive Chairman and Competition Manager Lindsay Hewison.

"Noel was asked by the President of the Kotara High School's P and C to coach the 1969 Open team for the CHS Knockout where he continued for the next decade with some success."

A highlight for Noel and his Kotara High team was a semi final berth in 1974 at CHS Open Knock-out.

In 1979 the late Bill Turner AO, then Hunter CHS Convenor, called a meeting of all the local CHS coaches at South Cardiff Soccer Club, to discuss the setting up of a new competition for boys 15-years-and-under.



The competition became known as the Bill Turner Cup and has been active for 43 years.

Noel was at that meeting and appointed to the inaugural committee, a position he currently holds. He coached Kotara High's first few Bill Turner Cup teams.

"Noel has been the Newcastle, Lake Macquarie and Upper Hunter Area Manager at various times during the last four decades, before becoming the Northern NSW State Manager – a position he still holds," said Lindsay.

Bill Turner School Football in 2016, awarded Life Membership to Noel Cocking, Terry Hampton and posthumously to Bill Turner.

Since Bill's passing in 2013 Noel has been an invaluable asset for Bill Turner School Football acting as a sounding board; where his advice, support and diligence has been welcomed by the executive committee and area managers alike.

The Noel Cocking Shield was struck after the 2019 Annual General Meeting where it was decided, by the executive, to award St Pius X Adamstown, who beat Newcastle High, the inaugural Noel Cocking Shield.

The 2020 Noel Cocking Shield was not contested due to COVID-19.

Noel's Kotara High won the 2021 Noel Cocking Shield with a win over St Pius X Adamstown.

This year the Noel Cocking Shield was presented to St Pius X Adamstown after they beat Callaghan College Wallsend.


