

### Matildas and Bill Turner Trophy Finals Series walk a common pathway

SIX of the current magnificent Matildas graced the same stage as this year's contestants in the Bill Turner Trophy National Finals Series.



Alana Kennedy (on left) and Caitlin Foord had a right royal duel in 2009 where Kennedy's Westfields Sports High rolled Foord's Illawarra Sports High 1-0 in the Grand Final.

Foord was named 2009 Player of the Series an award Kennedy held aloft in 2010.

Kennedy secured a treble of Bill Turner Trophy's in 2008's 2-1 win over Hunter Sports High, 2009's 1-0 triumph over Illawarra Sports High and the 2010 4-1 victory over Cavendish Road State High.

During Kennedy's time attending Westfields she played in the number-14 shirt which is also her Matildas playing number.

Hunter Sports High's Clare Wheeler was a Bill Turner Trophy winner in 2011 beating Westfields 2-1, ran fourth in 2012 and won, on penalties over Westfields in 2013.

Westfields' Ellie Carpenter (right) started her road to stardom with a loss to Hunter Sports in 2013, finished third in 2014 and lifted the coveted Trophy in 2015 being named Player of the Final with an emphatic 7-0 romp against Holy Spirit Bellambi.

The first of the final two players to the six piece puzzle is Katrina Gorry who was schooled at Brisbane's Cavendish Road State High.

Cavendish Road made the Bill Turner Trophy Finals in 2007 and 2009, finishing third both times, where Gorry donned the captain's armband in 2009.

Courtney Nevin rounds out the six, playing for Westfields in 2014 (third) and 2015 (champions).

All six of these fine athletes and accomplished footballers were an integral squad member of the Matildas who excelled at the 2023 Women's World Cup on home soil that captured the hearts of the nation.

### Bill Turner - 2013 Medal of the Order of Australia

Bill Turner was posthumously awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia by the NSW Governor on September 13 at Government House, Sydney. The award is for "service to football, and to the community, particularly youth." Bill Turner worked tirelessly with young people and school soccer while he was a music teacher at Lake Macquarie High (1961-1989). Through the 1960's and 1970's he helped form an Australian Schools Soccer programme, which included taking talented youngsters to play overseas. He was extensively involved with NSW Combined High Schools Soccer, which convened school competitions particularly for older youth. Bill and his committee established a knockout competition for 15 year olds, and the committee voted in Bill's absence to name the competition after him, as a tribute to his two decades of dedication to youth football. Bill's vision and leadership then helped the team take the competition from 34 teams in 1979, to over 800 teams presently.

Bill was also involved in school music, and he was instrumental in regional events featuring the best local musicians. These concerts were the forerunners of the current spectaculars.

With both music and football, Bill had a strong desire to provide opportunity for fun and involvement for high school students. He also wanted to ensure that the most talented youth would have a chance to shine, and be noticed, especially those young people not from the capital cities.

### HISTORY OF THE BILL TURNER TROPHY

In 1990 Ron Pratt and Sue Andrews of Combined High Schools were approached to introduce a knockout competition for Junior Girls. With the cooperation of the NSW Soccer Federation such a competition began in 1991 with Bass High the first winners. In 1994 and 1995 Lindsay Hewison and Warren Sheelah organised the competition, with Louise Yates taking over in 1996-1999. With the demise of the NSW Soccer Federation competition, the year 2000 saw the Northern NSW Schools Soccer Association Inc. introduce the Bill Turner Trophy and Lindsay Hewison Shield. Entries came from Northern NSW, NSW, ACT, QLD, Victoria. Brisbane's Cavendish Road were worthy winners of the expanded competition. 2004 also saw a development competition commence in Western Australia which was put on hold owing to not having a major sponsor.



# The Bill Turner Cup & Trophy

In 1979 a number of dedicated secondary school teachers met together and formed Northern NSW Schools Soccer. It was chaired by well known football identity and long serving Booragul High School (now Lake Macquarie High) teacher, Bill Turner.

During his absence from an executive meeting, they chose to name the competition the "Bill Turner Cup" and have it open to all State and Private Secondary Schools. In that year 34 such schools entered from around the Hunter Region.

Before a ball had been kicked, it had been bought to the attention of the leaders of the Northern NSW Soccer Federation. High profile, forward thinking and hard working president Stefan Kamasz plus his enthusiastic executive, studied, then embraced its whole FIFA Junior Rules concept . . . with endorsement, financial assistance and totally understood, affiliation.

The first ever final featured Belmont High and Whitebridge High at the famous Crystal Palace ground Wallsend.

Between 1997 and 2013 all series finals were conducted at the Jack McLaughlan Ground, home of the Edgeworth Eagles State League Soccer Club from the City of Lake Macquarie. Since 2015 finals have been conducted at the Lake Macquarie Regional Football Facility, home of Northern NSW Football.

In the year 2000 a request to take over an established, same age, girls competition was accepted, and the executive named it the Bill Turner Trophy. Its growth has been outstanding and now in entries, matches the cup.

For many years now, the Mayor and Councillors for the City of Lake Macquarie have welcomed all eight cup and trophy semifinalists, team officials, school supporters, special guests and chosen speakers to a Civic Reception, held at their Speers Point Auditorium. Sincere thanks is ever expressed, and all eight semifinalists are required to attend.

Efforts to obtain sponsorship for the competitions and / or finals series have had no success. Consequently, the executive has been compelled to charge each school entering a moderate entry fee. Apart from the two football state financial sponsors Northern NSW and NSW, the executive, is very grateful to receive from a number of industries, gifts, to be presented to players for special achievements.

### Terry Hampton was one of the visionaries that set up the Bill Turner Cup in 1979

TERRY Hampton is a life member of Northern NSW Schools Football Incorporated - known as Bill Turner School Football - along with having a shield named in his honour.



The Terry Hampton Shield is presented annually to the runner-up in the Bill Turner Cup competition.

"Dad first became involved in football in the early 1970s," his son Michael explained.

"The story goes he was sent, by mum to the local Toronto Awaba football club Annual General Meeting to petition for a change in short colour as mum was sick of trying to get grass stains out of my white cotton shorts."

Not only did Terry be successful in having the short colour changed to royal blue he was elected president of the Lake Macquarie based club.

Michael said his Dad: "had began his journey and passion for Football administration that has spanned four+ decades."

"Dad dabbled with the Tasman Cup during the power years of Booragul and Wallsend high schools," Michael continued.

"He was close with his great teacher mate Bill Turner."

The Tasman Cup, now known as the Puma Cup, was augmented in the the late 70s with the introduction of the 15-years-and-under Bill Turner Cup.

Terry was an inaugural member of the organising committee that steered the birth of the Northern NSW Schools competition - the Bill Turner Cup.

Terry was Vice President and Competition Manager of Bill Turner School Football from 1979 to 2002.

"Dad managed numerous overseas touring teams with all students returning home in one piece due to meticulous attention to detail," Michael said.

"This drove him and the committee of the Bill Turner Cup to create an unprecedented school competition open to all schools and all genders in the formative years of 15-and-under football.

"It is a masterful achievement by those school visionaries."


